HOST LINE

This is the line that denotes who is hosting (or paying for) the wedding, for example, "Together with their families" or "Mr & Mrs Adam Jackson cordially invite you to the wedding celebration of their daughter".

THE HAPPY COUPLE

In general, the brides name comes first. If you are opting for an informal feel to your invitations then you can use your first names only, for more formal invitations it is usual to use your full names.

REQUEST TEXT

This line is where you would ask guests to attend: e.g. "Invite you to celebrate their wedding at a reception on" or "Request the pleasure of your company at their wedding reception" (or left blank).*

** For weddings where the parents are hosting, you may have included this already in the host line above the names of the happy couple, for example, "Mr and Mrs Cole Harrison and Mrs Kate Sharp request the pleasure of your company at the wedding reception of their children..."*

VENUE

You can either add the venue and town, or a full address.

DATE AND TIME

WEDDING DATE

In the format you would like it printing, eg "12th September 2020" or "12/09/2020".

TIME

For example, "7 O'Clock in the Evening" or "4:30 PM".

EXTRA DETAILS

You might want to add your children policy, plus-one information, RSVP details or a dress code.
